

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	WHAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED AT THIS TIME	HOW TO PREPARE MATERIALS FOR RECYCLING
Glass	Clear, amber and green beverage bottles and food jars	Broken glass, light bulbs, dishes, drinking glasses, window glass, mirrors, ceramics, Pyrex or tempered glass	Rinse bottles and jars Remove & discard lids, Do not break glass (labels may be left on)
Aluminum, Steel and Bi-Metal Cans	Food & beverage cans	Aluminum foil, cans containing food, clothes hangers, scrap metal, screws, nails, toys, lawn furniture, paint cans, aluminum siding	Rinse cans (crush if space is needed). Please push lid down inside can Wipe out greasy containers
PLASTICS (PET, HDPE) Stamped #1-#7 on bottom	Plastic bottles and containers with #1 through #7 on bottoms, clear and green plastic soda bottles, milk and water jugs, liquid detergent, bleach and softener bottles, hair care bottles	Styrofoam peanuts and blocks, plastic plant pots, foam plastic egg cartons, plastic wrap, bubble wrap, plastic bags (loose nor bundled), CD & DVD's, toys, lawn furniture, motor oil, cooking oil, herbicide, antifreeze	Rinse, remove and discard lids (crush if space is needed) (LIDS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE. BE SURE TO REMOVE & DISCARD)
PAPER AND CARDBOARD	Clean corrugated and pressed cardboard cartons, paperboard boxes (cereal, shoes, etc.) paper (all colors), magazines, newspapers, advertising inserts, junk mail (including envelopes), catalogs, phone books, paperbound books, paper bags	Pizza boxes, hardback books, wax paper, milk cartons, juice boxes, take-out food containers, colored wrapping paper, tissue paper and boxes, padded envelopes, soiled or contaminated cardboard	Flatten or break down in pieces no larger than 4' Remove all packing material (Styrofoam blocks, peanuts, bubble wrap, etc.) Remove bag handles Staples may be left in Place shredded paper in brown paper bag Place loose in, under or beside recycling container <u>PLEASE DO NOT PLACE OUT ON WET DAYS!</u>
