1. <u>Suspend Burning Ordinance – American Legion</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Brough, seconded by Mr. Celli, to suspend the burning ordinance for the purpose of the American Legion Post #157 to host a flag retirement ceremony on August 4 from 9-12pm at Legion Park. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

2. <u>Holy Redeemer Bazaar</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Brough, seconded by Ms. Guerrera, to approve the request by Holy Redeemer Parish to close Third Street from Lawrence Avenue to Crescent Avenue and Cherry Way from Crescent Avenue to Lawrence Avenue from August 1 - 4 during their annual Bazaar. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

1. <u>Award Bid – Sewer Main Removal/Replacement (105 Sixth Street)</u>
A motion was made by Mr. Barry, seconded by Mr. Celli, to award the bid for the Sewer Main Removal/Replacement Project located at 105 Sixth Street to JS Bova Excavating (Struthers, OH) at the bid of \$79,000 plus the Add Alternate \$10,000 (Total \$89,000). This amount will be paid from the Sewage Collection Fund. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

1. <u>Softball Tournament</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Barry, seconded by Mr. Brough, to approve the request by Deborah Murdock to use the Girl's, Women's & Men's Softball fields in Stiefel Park for a softball tournament benefitting St. Jude's Hospital and in memory of Richard Hogue on July 12, 13, 14, 2019. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

2. <u>Club Hope Foundation – Hair for Hope Cut-a-Thon</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Barry, seconded by Ms. Mancini, to approve the request by the Club Hope Foundation to use the Community Plaza on July 24 from 6-8pm for a "Hair for Hope Cut-a-Thon". Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

1. Employment (Ratify) – Peyton Hunt (Part-Time)(Public Works)

A motion was made by Mr. Celli, seconded by Mr. Barry, to ratify the employment of Peyton Hunt (part-time)(Public Works) at the rate of \$15.00/hour for up to 28 hours per week. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

2. <u>Accept DROP – Ptl. Richard List</u>

A motion was made by Ms. Mancini, seconded by Ms. Lamenza, to accept the entrance into the Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP) by Ptl. Richard List, retroactive to 5/1/18. His last day of employment will be 4/30/22. A benefit calculation will be provided by the Borough's Actuary once police contract negotiations are settled. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

3. Amendment to Local #964 Contract (Laborers)

A motion was made by Mr. Barry, seconded by Mr. Brough, to approve the Amendment to the Local #964 Laborers' Contract (Public Works, Electric, Wastewater), as submitted, relative to the employment of part-time employees. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

1. Uniform Construction Code

2. <u>Lawrence Co. Repository – 1114 Lawrence Avenue</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Celli, seconded by Ms. Guerrera, to approve the bid for the Lawrence Co. Repository property located at 1114 Lawrence Avenue (11-004600) to Zachary & Danielle Clouse for \$600.01. Voice vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

3. Agreement – Borough & Ellwood City Revitalization

A motion was made by Mr. Barry, seconded by Mr. Celli, to approve an amendment to the Agreement, with Ellwood City Revitalization (ECR) relative to the development of 509/511 Lawrence Avenue and 513/515 Lawrence Avenue specifically granting the Developer (Lawrence Avenue Development LLC) a six (6) month extension to develop said lots. The amendment would extend the Agreement until June 18, 2020. Roll call vote. All voted against, except Mr. Celli and Ms. Lamenza. Motion FAILED 5-2.
