4. <u>Transfer - \$47,475 to Electric Capital Reserve from Electric Fund</u> The Electric Usage Sold in 2021 was 47,475,239 kwh. Borough Ordinance #2211, Section 38: Purchase Power Adjustment states that one mill (.001) per kilowatt hour is charged for the purpose of capital improvements. Therefore, a motion was made by Ms. Williams, seconded by Mr. Ovial, to transfer \$47,475 to the Electric Capital Reserve Fund from the Electric Fund. This entry shall be reflected on the books for 2021. Roll call vote; all in favor. Motion carried.

5. <u>Donation – Lawrence Co. Tourist Promotion Agency</u>, \$100
